Town is seeking a Regional Scallop Restoration Program with six other Towns to be funded through settlement funds from the Bouchard Oil Spill.

Town developed a Harbor Launch Service that would come to pick up and drop off boaters in Mattapoissett Harbor. The Launch is owned and operated by the Mattapoissett Boat Yard.

The Town approved a Photovoltaic Project for the Town Landfill Site off of Tinkham Hill Road.

Blue Wave Energy was approved for a Photovoltaic Project to the north of Tinkham Hill Road.

The Town is in process of making public facilities and parks fully accessible to all.

It was noted that the Town appointed its first Agricultural Commission.

The Town and surrounding communities were affected by Hurricane Sandy, causing prolonged power outages, significant tree damage, and limited damage due to flooding.

The Center School Clock was restored through donations made by many Mattapoissett residents, and the Community Preservation Fund. Raymond Andrews spearheaded the fund raising, coordination of the restoration work and continued custodial care of the clock. Raymond Andrews was named the official timekeeper of the clock.
