DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

- **What radio station carries Town emergency announcements?**
 - WBSM 1420 AM and FHN 107.1 FM

- **Where is the shelter and how do I know when it is open?**
 - The shelter is in the Old Rochester Regional High School, 135 Marion Rd., in Mattapoisett.
 - Notification to the public will be made to the public if the shelter will be open.

- **What if I cannot drive myself to the shelter?**
 - Depending on the emergency, there may be Town transportation. Police will assist, when available, with transportation.

- **Will the shelter accept my pet?**
 - Yes. Pets must be crated. Owners are responsible for caring for their pets at the shelter. Pets will not be in the same room with people. There is a separate pet room.

- **I know there is reverse 911 capability for land line phones, but what about my cell phone?**
 - The Mattapoisett Police Dept. website has information on CODE RED alerts. Go to mattapoisettpolice.com, select "forms," Select "CodeRed," and then select "Click Here" to fill out the form.

- **I live alone and in an isolated location. Is there a list I can get on to have someone do a wellness check on me, especially in an emergency?**
 - You may register on the "police Reassurance Plan." To learn more about the plan, contact the Mattapoisett Police Dept. or the Council on Aging.



Be Prepared for an Emergency.

Be Red Cross Ready!

Being prepared means being equipped with the proper supplies you may need in the event of an emergency or disaster.

Keep your supplies in an easy-to-carry emergency preparedness kit that you can use at home or take with you in case you must evacuate.

At a minimum, you should have the basic supplies listed below:

- Water—one gallon per person, per day (3-day supply for evacuation, 2-week supply for home).
- Food—non-perishable, easy-to-prepare items (3-day supply for evacuation, 2-week supply for home).
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Battery-powered or hand-crank radio (NOAA Weather Radio, if possible).
- First aid kit

- Medications (7-day supply) and medical items
- Cell phone with chargers
- Multi-purpose tool
- Sanitation and personal hygiene items
- Copies of personal documents: medication list and pertinent medical information, proof of address, deed/lease to home, passports, birth certificates, insurance policies.
- Family and emergency contact information
- Extra cash
- Emergency blanket
- Map(s) of the area
