## TOWN CLERK'S REPORT for 2012

The year 2012 kept the Clerk's Office busy. We were kept on our toes with Town Meeting, and absentee voting and preparation for four elections with a record voter turnout of 85% for the Presidential Election in November. The Board of Registrars and the dedicated election and town meeting workers helped to make the process run smoothly.

And I would remiss if I didn't express my deep and sincere appreciation to my staff for the long hours they worked to make sure every absentee ballot was properly processed, every procedure in place, every new voter added to our rolls. The number of registered voters at the end of 2012 was 4,774.

The Fire Department, Highway Department and Police Department were instrumental in the smooth election process. They assisted in the setup of the polls the day before the election and made sure that all equipment and ballots were delivered by 6:00AM on Election Day, and that the flow of traffic went smoothly. To all of you a heartfelt thank you.

The Annual and Special Town Meetings in May lasted once again in one evening with an approximately attendance of 231 voters.

Over 1200 dog licenses were issued over the past year. Vital statistics for the year changed only slightly with 40 Births, 47 Deaths, and 41 Marriages. The population count is 6,292. Twenty-eight new businesses registered in 2012.

Once again I would like to take this opportunity to publicly thank my staff, Theresa Gomes and Bobbi Gaspar for their diligence and hard work that helps to keep this office running smoothly.
